Maximum length of the documents : 10 mn - a longer text of about 8 mn (interview, class, conference...) - 2 listenings - a few short radio documents (news, surveys, advertisements) - 1 listening</p> <p>⇒ <b>Reading</b> Questions on a 1500 to 2000-word text presenting ideas (literary or journalistic)</p> <p>⇒ <b>Speaking</b> Oral presentation based on some written texts followed by a discussion with the jury <i>The candidate can choose from 2 themes : arts and humanities or sciences</i></p> <p>⇒ <b>Writing</b> - Summary and synthesis of a few texts (about 1000 words) referring to a selected field of study (arts and human sciences or sciences) - Expository essay on the content of the above texts</p>	<p>40 mn</p> <p>50 mn</p> <p>30 mn + 1h00 prep</p> <p>2h30</p>
